McLean Doctor's Book Signing Event

Monday, March 17, 2008, McLean, Virginia – The TaBois–Bonhomme Galerie d'Art held its premiere Book Signing Event for McLean resident and first-time author R. A. Comunale, M.D., at its gallery located in the Regency at McLean, 1800 Old Meadow Road, Suite 113, near Tysons Corner.

The Book Signing Event for Dr. Comunale's first novel, *Requiem for the Bone Man*, was held on Saturday and Sunday, March 15 -16, 2008, from 2 p.m. – 5 p.m., and it was well attended. Comunale read passages from his as yet unpublished fourth book on both days, readings that captivated the audience. Among the listeners was William F. Gavin, an author in his own right, whose comments appear on the back cover of Comunale's book. He wrote:
